

Dear Parents,

Below is a summary of the emergency call from the State's Commissioner of Education and Department of Education, as well as some brief points to explain our situation until we have further guidance.

What we know:

- This is an unprecedented, rapidly evolving situation. What that means is that information is coming fast, without warning, and may counter or otherwise change any prior information.
- Until April 15th, at a minimum, schools are closed. At this point, we have not been directed to submit a distance learning plan for students, but we do have one ready to activate should that be the next directive.
- There are many waivers in consideration regarding instructional time, contracted time, and student course credit; so please allow enough time for formal adoption and approval of new policies that will be shared in the future. We are awaiting approval and guidance from the State.
- There are local options to provide food for students in need, and the state is
 working on a potential plan to enhance access to food for children. We will post
 on our website the local depots for children for breakfast and lunch. All children
 ages 1 to 18 have access to this regardless of their current economic status and
 the sites are posted below this letter.

What we don't know yet:

- When school will be back in session at physical sites.
- How this will impact our long-term school calendar.
- Whether or not we will be required to make up any lost days and lost IEP-related service times.
- How students, especially high school seniors, will receive course credit.
- When, or if, accountability and college placement exams will be offered.

Lastly, I believe that together we will all get through this if we continue to work collaboratively, stay calm, and put our students first. We can do this, and I know we will!
